First Reading: Deuteronomy 18:15-20

Prophecy for ancient Israel was mediation between themselves and God. The true prophet is a native Israelite and called by God.

Second Reading: I Corinthians 7:32-35

Paul expresses the equality of men and women in his discussion of sexual status in the community. He gives clear advice but he does not impose solutions.

Gospel: Mark 1:21-28

Mark recounts in this chapter an eventful day in Capernaum, St. Peter's home town. First, Jesus performs an exorcism. But the main point for Mark is that the same power that enables Jesus' healing also underscores the authority of His teaching.

**Pulpit Announcement by Father Thadeus
January 24th. And 25th., 2015
Elimination of the 10:30 Mass**

We are all aware that attendance at the Masses here at St. Boniface has been declining over the past several years. The main contributing factors are the demographics of the neighborhood and the aging of our parishioners.

After much discussion and prayerful consideration, it was decided that the reality of the matter is that it is time to make some difficult decisions with regard to the Mass schedule.

It was decided that the 10:30 Mass, being the least attended, would be eliminated. This would impact the fewest members of the parish. The plan is to leave the 5PM Saturday and the Sunday 9AM Mass schedules as they are thus affecting the least amount of parishioners. The change will take effect on the weekend of May 30 and 31 that comes after Memorial Day this year.

It is going to be a challenge for some to adjust, but as a whole we will survive these changes in keeping with the "Making All Things New" initiative.
