Pentecost Sunday May 15, 2016

First Reading: Acts 2:1-11

The Holy Spirit is the principal mover of this dramatic event, which marks the "birthday" of the Church. The list of the peoples' nationalities underscores the outreach of the disciples' message to the wider world of the Gentiles.

Second Reading: I Corinthians 12:3b-7, 2-13

St. Paul writes about the diversity of the Spirit's gifts, and the needs of the nascent Church for them to be used. Together, these gifts enrich the one Body of Christ, the Church.

Gospel: John 20:19-23

The dramatic appearance of Jesus to the disciples brings them His unique gift of peace. His bodily scars identify Him, but He is nevertheless mysteriously different. Forgiveness of sins augments His gift of peace.

Reflection by Rev. Leonard N. Peterson

Whether it comes as a nightclub brawl, a drive by shooting, or an all out military battle, there is something upsetting about violence. It entered the human chronicle after Eden's gates closed. Then came mankind's discovery of weaponry, which made him an aggressor.

How welcome is the wonder of peace when it finally comes! It is the soothing solution to his use of force as a solution to disputes. Against that long history, how wonderful it is that the risen Lord Jesus' first words to His faithful disciples were "Peace be with you."

There has been abundant analysis citing the twentieth century as one of the most violent. The slaughter of millions of people remains so unimaginable that we hasten to attribute blame to twisted minds or blind patriotism. Friends of mine told me recently that their German tour guide hardly referred to a prison camp some short distance from their route. Such places will mar that country's history for a long time.

Jesus was a victim of violence in both mental and bodily form. Roman punishment was terrible enough with crucifixion, but the shouts of the crowd on Good Friday added to His agony. So we can say:

"Violence killed God." The gospel is our evidence.

So wonderful then was Easter! The triumph of good over evil cannot be overstated. But today's feast has the added wonder in that the Holy Spirit came to those frightened disciples enabling them to believe in Jesus in a whole new way. The same Spirit comes to us now to believe and spread the good word.

Make no mistake, the task is daunting. So damaged has our world become that it wears a kind of "crust" of cynicism over its better self. It is wary of fraud and hollow promises. Our Christian message is authentic and as solid as a rock. In fact it is built on a rock named Peter, and protected from the worst assault Satan can mount.

The miracle of language described by St. Luke in the Acts of the Apostles is all the proof we need. If there have been any problems with authenticity along the Church's march through history, they have sprung from the contradictory actions of Christians.

Meanwhile, as the great Lent-Easter cycle of celebration comes to an end, we can rejoice that we have lived through it with our faith both tested and triumphant. We dare not be smug about it, for the threat of violence is always ready to rob us of our inner peace. But such forces will never triumph. We have the Holy Spirit's Word for it.
