The 24th. Sunday in Ordinary Time September 11, 2016

First Reading: Exodus 32:7-11, 13-14

Yahweh plans to destroy the people for their disobedience to His first commandment about idolatry. Moses implores the Lord to relent.

Second Reading: I Timothy 1:12-17

St. Paul admits that he once acted out of ignorance when he persecuted the Church. His conversion becomes a model of future conversions, which are products of God's mercy.

Gospel: Luke 15:1-32, or Luke 15:1-10

Luke provides three stories to illustrate how God's mercy far exceeds human expectations. A shepherd who abandons ninety-nine sheep to save one, and a woman who turns her house upside down to find a little coin, seem ridiculously disproportionate. But in the third story, contained in the longer Reading, we find drama, poignancy and a touching example of filial mercy.

Three to one. That could be a recipe direction calling for cups of flour and another ingredient. Or the odds for a racetrack bet. But here I suggest it is the trio of stories Jesus tells to illustrate one point: namely the superabundant nature of God's mercy. In this Church's Year of Mercy, this section of Luke's Gospel is most appropriate. With typical mastery, Jesus teaches a beautiful and consoling truth to sinners.

Regular Mass-goers and faithful bible readers both know the three stories by their given titles: "The Lost Sheep"; "The Lost Coin", and (in the longer version available today) the misnamed "Prodigal Son." The first two make their point with typical Hebrew humorous exaggeration. But the last one about the father and his two boys, stands out for both its drama and poignancy. It should be known as "The Merciful Father," for that man is the real hero, representing God the Father and His love for sinners.

What a wonderful story that is! Fit to uplift anyone trapped by sin, or the captivity of addiction, or any trying situation. I find it a most consoling preparation for receiving the Sacrament of Reconciliation.

I for one love that line in the story that prompts an image in my mind: "When he was still a long way off, his father caught sight of him and was filled with compassion." In my mind's eye I see the young man's father following a habit of scouring the hills near the horizon each twilight after a long day looking for that familiar silhouette of his son with his recognizable walk. Then suddenly a smile blooms on his face when finally it happens. His son returns! That's our God my dear sisters and brothers, always watching for us to come home when we have strayed and sinned.

The prodigal's return gives the father the energy he needs to deal with his narrow-minded and jealous older son, who represents another side of us that comes to the fore when we see others getting attention.

You and I may not connect as easily with the lost sheep and coin stories, but we do with the two sons and their father. Maybe we've strayed from Christ, at least in our attitude toward the Mass and the sacraments. Or from a Christlike approach to life. We may, with our denigrating remarks about Church leaders or our fellow parishioners, in our own petty way, acted like persecutors of the Church, as St. Paul once was. Mercy covers that too.

When we hear this particular Word of God, our contrition should hopefully well up from within us enough to want to change. Our conscience becomes a kind of "Moses," imploring God to hold back any of His just punishment and forgive us. Suddenly we want to make amends.

Is it any wonder that these sacred writings of Matthew, Mark, Luke and John are called "gospels?" The word, after all, means "Good News." When it comes to us just when we need it, we realize that we don't change the message; the message changes us.
