31st. Sunday in Ordinary Time November 5, 2017

First Reading: Malachi 1:14b-2:2b, 8-10

The prophet scolds the priests for not regarding God's ways. Their instructions have become burdensome.

Second Reading: I Thessalonians 2:7b-9, 13

Paul writes of his affection for the community, and the fact that he never wished to be a burden to them. He thanks God that they have heard the word of God.

Gospel: Matthew 23:1-12

The Pharisees, successors to Moses, have offered sound teaching but they did not practice what they preached. True greatness is humble service.

Reflection by Rev. Leonard N. Peterson

I was never very good at math. I don't mean the basic stuff that lets one balance a checkbook. It was the higher matters like geometry and trig. I just never could see the point of studying rectangles and right angles. Not to omit the exotic sounding isosceles triangle, although we confront them often on our computers as yellow warning signs. Little did I realize this many years ago that math is really about logic in our thinking and acuity in our observations.

All of this came to mind as I pondered the flaw Our Lord found so prevalent in the thoughts and actions of the scribes and Pharisees. It was pride in the specific form it takes in self-righteousness. An astute observer I came across wrote that self-righteousness is like a bottomless cup: though you pour and pour, you will never be able to fill it. Because pouring yourself into yourself adds nothing to you. And (here comes the math reference) "Nothing plus nothing always equals nothing."

It is always best to accept God's righteousness rather than trying to accumulate your own. You will find that the righteousness He offers is real. And that is what fills the cup of sanctification. Becoming holy, our main objective in life, becomes a much more satisfying occupation, if not an always easy one.

Anyone familiar with the New Testament, or even an occasional worshipper who listens to it read to him or her, knows that Jesus definitely put "the black hats" on the heads of the scribes and Pharisees. He despised their habitual way of preaching without matching practice. They playacted as we know it these days as someone who is quite different in behavior and speech, as we might say it, "when the camera is switched on."

Both groups started out as good men. They honored the traditions of their people, and saw everything in the light of the Mosaic law. They preached obedience to that law. They also knew their obligation was to teach and guide the uneducated masses who could not even read that Law. But then their accumulated power over time went to their heads. And it never again energized their behavior.

Obviously you and I are to be so careful that we don't fall into the same trap. It's so easy. A little rationalization here and there about whether or not we have sinned. Or a decision that the Sacrament of Reconciliation applies to other people because we don't need to go to confession. Then there is the pressure of the culture and an innate tendency to blend in at all costs. Jesus never did that. His refusal to do so can be embarrassing if our main desire is to be like everybody else, and never, never to suffer the label of "fanatic" by the conformists who dominate the society.

So, if "nothing plus nothing always equals nothing" we can thank the Lord that each of us is something in God's eyes. Better still, we are each a someone to Him, redeemable and lovable. If we keep at this business of living as a Christian, we know for sure, as St. Paul put it in I Thessalonians, "the word of God is now at work in us who believe." And, as for that math that gets tougher to grasp past the basics, we believe that working word "adds up" in our favor.
