7th. Sunday of Easter

May 28, 2017

First Reading: Acts 1:12-14

After the Lord's Ascension, the Eleven Apostles return to the Upper Room, and together with Blessed Mary and "some women", they form the young Church at prayer.

Second Reading: I Peter 4:13-16

Here we read about how to face the inevitable persecution that our Christian faith engenders. How relevant in these times! We must see it as a share in Christ's own suffering, and a definite path to one's future glory.

Gospel: John 17:1-11a

Jesus prays to His Father, asking that He be given the glory He had before the creation, now that He has accomplished His "work." He also prays for His disciples that the father has given Him and who have believed that the Father sent Him.

Reflection by Rev. Leonard N. Peterson

There is much ado in the news these days about people's online information being hacked. The consequent loss of privacy is unnerving. The problem stretches from our personal privacy being threatened all the way to the government secrets revealed on WikiLeaks. No longer are conversations only overheard if the speaker(s) are loud or if we happen to have a good listening spot.

How different from all this is the blessing we receive when a great person speaks his or her mind and wants us to listen. They can actually inspire us. The Gettysburg address of President Lincoln, for example, ennobled the sacrifice of our fallen soldiers then and there, and for all time. We think of them and all our deceased heroes and heroines this Memorial Day weekend.

We reach an even higher level when we learn of the prayers of saints like Francis of Assisi, Catherine of Sienna, Thomas More and Mother Teresa which we can adapt to our own life situations.

Today we "overhear" part of Jesus' prayer to His heavenly Father made just before His passion and death. It was recorded by John in his gospel, which ultimately means it is a gift of the Holy Spirit. Note how self-effacing Jesus is, even though He is the Father's equal as the Second Person of the Blessed Trinity. How trusting and honest. How mindful of the needs of His disciples.

These are all desirable qualities for our own prayer. How self-centered we can be in our prayers. They sound so much like a list of requests, if not demands on God. I believe that God hears our prayers best when we imitate the style and manner of the Prayer Jesus taught us. There we see that the opening lines are all about praise of God's name and a wish for His will to be done before getting to some basic petitions.

Of course, we first have to believe in the power of our own prayer and its effectiveness. Here is a gentle reminder:

Once upon a time a tavern was being built in a town that until recently had been dry. A group of Christians in a certain church opposed this and began an all night prayer vigil, asking God to intervene. Lightning struck the tavern building, and it burned to the ground. The owner brought a lawsuit against the church, claiming they were responsible. The Christians hired a lawyer, claiming they were not responsible. The judge said, "No matter how this case comes out, one thing is clear. The tavern owner believes in prayer and the Christians do not."
