17th. Sunday in Ordinary Time July 30, 2017

First Reading: I Kings 3:5, 7-12

Yahweh is pleased with Solomon for his request of "an understanding heart" to judge the people rightly. He does not ask for riches or a long life.

Second Reading: Romans 8:28-30

For Paul, those who love God receive His blessing and the guarantee of future glorification.

Gospel: Matthew 13:44-52, or 13:44-46

Jesus' parables continue from last weekend's Gospel section. The kingdom of God is such a valuable gift that a wise person would gladly give up all he/she has to gain it.

Reflection by Rev. Leonard N. Peterson

Those “of a certain age” will easily recall comedian Jack Benny, whose shows appears on You Tube these days. The schtick that he created for himself was that of a miser. A famous radio recording is all you need to enjoy the humor of the tightwad being robbed. The thief demands “Your money or your life!” There is an exaggeratedly long pause that makes the robber shout “Well?” To which Benny annoyingly replies, “I’m thinking, I’m thinking!”

Hopefully none of us here will ever get to that extreme in protecting our earthly gains. But when you look from side to side in present day America, you soon realize that Benny’s answer is not that far off from what many fellow citizens might answer a thief. Everything is about money. There is admiration if not pure jealousy of those who have it from those who don’t.

Even our institutions of higher education have to struggle with the idea that a university is to provide students with what they need to get a high paying job rather than learning for its own sake.

Now if there is any magazine reflective of the culture, it’s certainly the “New Yorker.” A cartoon from their tear off calendar appeared one May day that fits like a glove as it makes a statement. The cartoonist has a doctor addressing his patient who is sitting up on the examination table looking anxious. The doctor tells him, “Stress is killing you. You need an easier job, a smaller house, and a different family.”

If today’s Scripture Readings could talk, they would practically be shouting, “Listen to what that doctor says!” Better still, “Listen to the Holy Spirit speaking through those Readings!”

First we hear about Solomon’s encounter with the Lord newly crowned king. To God’s question, “What do you want?” Solomon answers that he does not want riches, long life, or success fighting his enemies, but an understanding heart. With that, he would be able to make wise judgments of his people. In the Second Reading, St. Paul tells his Roman readers that everything works for good for people whose top priority is doing God’s will.

Finally, in the Gospel, Jesus talks about His kingdom as a treasure; as a pearl of great price, and a dragnet full of good and bad items. Note that last. At the end of time, angels will separate the wicked (read here “those with only worldly values”) from the righteous (read “God-minded people”). The wicked will be tossed into a fiery furnace where they will grind their teeth. That’s not a cartoon image, friends, nor just a bad dental habit.

So for all our climbing of ladders and inflating of bank accounts, we just have to come to grips with an unchallenged truth like this: “Heaven is a bargain, however great the cost.”
