23rd. Sunday in Ordinary Time September 9, 2018

First Reading: Deuteronomy 4:1-2, 6-8 Moses, as teacher of the people, points to the law and stresses that observance of it is essential to possessing the land. Only the Israelite nation has such a personal connection with its God, and can call on Him for aid and comfort.

Second Reading: James 1:17-18, 21b-22, 27 God, the creator of the heavens, freely gave birth to us. So the word in which we were born must not only be heard but also lived. We learn what a "pure" religion looks like.

Gospel: Mark 7:1-8, 14-15, 21-23

The Pharisees and scribes complain that Jesus' disciples failed to follow the traditional Jewish practices of ritual purification. Jesus then makes a radical statement about where true defilement originates.

Reflection by Rev. Leonard N. Peterson

I am sure that you have been disconcerted by at least one item the last time you ate at a restaurant and had to use the restroom. It's that little sign hanging on the wall there that reads: "Employees must wash hands." Really? Do workers at an eating establishment really have to be told? I thought we were well past cave man crudeness.

Of course, there's the other extreme of this notion of cleanliness. Hospital shows on TV often show us surgeons "scrubbing up" before an operation, sometimes soaping their forearms as well as their hands. Somewhere in this cleanliness graph comes the ancient Jewish tradition of ritual purification mentioned in this weekend's Gospel passage. It was required not just for one's hands, as St. Mark informs us, but also for cups, jugs, kettles and even, of all things, beds!

As per usual, Jesus and His disciples are always ripe targets for criticism by the Pharisees and scribes when it came to violations of the law, in this instance when they are observed eating with unwashed hands. The questioning of this aberration offers Jesus the perfect opportunity to teach His opponents just where authentic defilement originates. It's all about internals. Something prompts me to think the Pharisees and scribes already knew this, but were loathe to admit it.

Fast forward to our contemporary culture and what do we find? A sudden presence of hand cleaner gadgets available everywhere. Hot air hand dryers in public restrooms, the better to promote sanitation and save untold numbers of trees, an added bonus. We have all manner of ecology friendly devices to keep our hands and homes clean.

All this and more while at the same time society benignly allows for the production and distribution of pornography, with its millions of profit dollars. There is a proliferation of so-called "gentlemen's clubs" in town and city. Filth flowing from the language used by our entertainers. Provocative clothing styles available for both genders. A general debasement of chastity. This not an exclusive list.

Allow me a prayer response. "Dear Jesus, You are not simply "good and gentle," as we so often think and pray. We witness in this Scripture passage from Mark how resoundingly radical You can be at times. How even the mention of Your name is despicable in many circles of the outwardly respectable people among us. But they and we know instinctively that You are right. We know what defiles us. We need Your mercy to wash us clean on the inside first. The only reminder we need is the sign of Your cross. As for our measure, we accept that 'God grades on the cross, and not the curve.' Amen."
